Disproportionate Minority Contact (DMC) Adhoc Committee

The committee met on January 21, 2011 from 1pm – 3pm at the Criminal Justice Resource Center. Arnold Dennis and Donald Pinchback gave a brief overview of the meeting. Several presentations were received:

Brandy Dolby: Ms. Dolby discussed the Governor’s Crime Commission’s (GCC) involvement in the DMC issue since 2004. Nationally, North Carolina is in compliance with DMC requirements. GCC funded four counties: Forsyth, Union, New Hanover, and Guilford as demonstration sites for DMC. She presented facts and statistics illustrating the magnitude of the issue. Union County is an excellent model to demonstrate the success that could be obtained through implementation of the proper program.

Jamal Carr: Mr. Carr discussed what he had done thus far in trying to improve DMC rates. He stated that he has traveled across the state providing training at youth development centers, as well as for juvenile court counselors. He said that he would continue to work with juvenile court counselors in an effort to reduce DMC rates.

Renee Porter: Ms. Porter gave a brief history of DMC. It was mentioned that Durham had one of the highest DMC rates in the state, and that the main problem is in the form of referrals. She also talked about DMC issues specific to Durham.

Outcomes of the meeting were plans to develop goals and objectives, and construct a resource booklet for SROs and police officers listing services for juveniles. Arnold will set up meetings with the Durham Crime Cabinet and the City/County Violence Prevention Committee, and he will talk with school principals regarding DMC.
